Diana Hanbury King has been working with dyslexic students since 1950 when she worked with Helene Durbrow at Sidwell Friends School and became involved in the program that was then supervised by Anna Gillingham. In 1955, she established a summer program for dyslexic students that is the old est program of its kind in the country. In 1969, together with Kurt Goldman, she founded the Kildonan School io Pennsylvania.



In 1980, the school moved to its present location in Amenia, New York. During the past ten years, she has devoted her efforts to writing material and training teachers. This book is the result of the need teachers have expressed to know more about our language.
