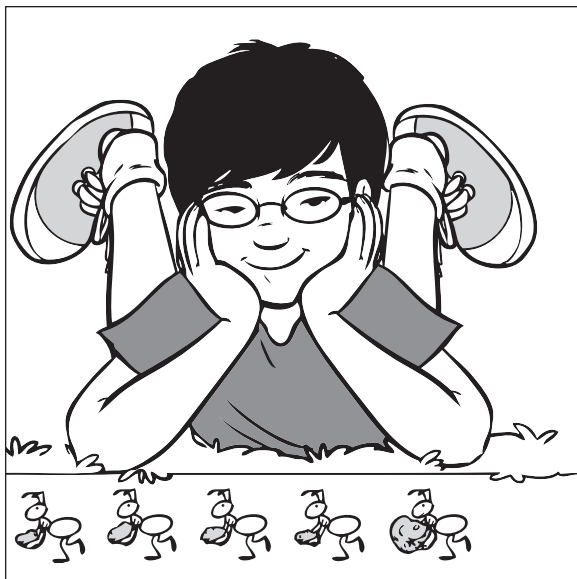


Lesson 1: Ant Needs Help

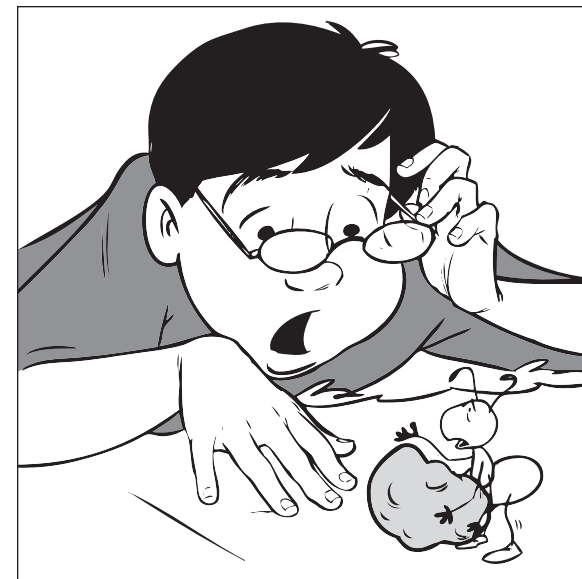
Read the story and look at the pictures.

Level 1

Level 2

6. What does the ant need help doing?
7. Do you think John will help the ant?
8. At the end of the story, why is the ant asking for help?

Level 3

9. How could John help the ant?
10. Is this story real or made-up?
How do you know?

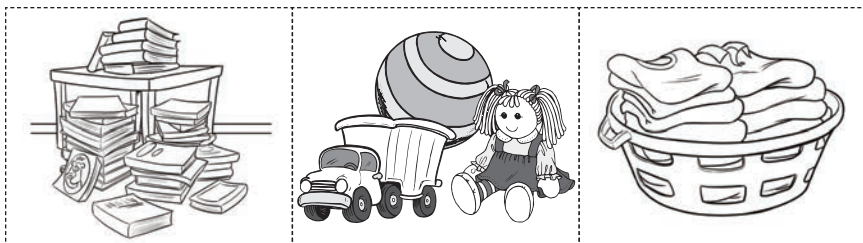
Lesson 1: Ant Needs Help

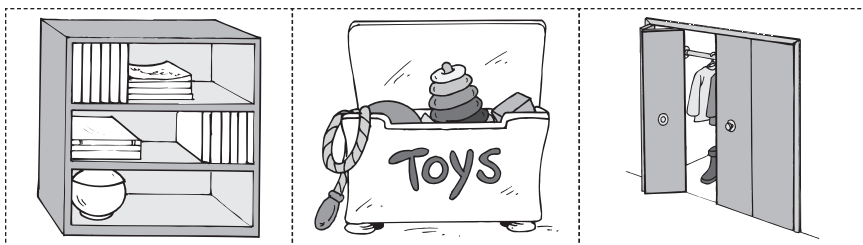
1. Who will try to move something?

Story Question Prompts

1. Tell me about each picture.
2. What happens first? Next? Last?
3. Who is trying to move something?
4. What is the person moving?
5. Where does the person move the things?

Personal Application Prompts

1. Who is someone you have helped?
2. What did the person need help doing?
3. What did you do to help?
4. How did helping make you feel?
5. Tell me someone you would like to help.
How would you like to help the person?
